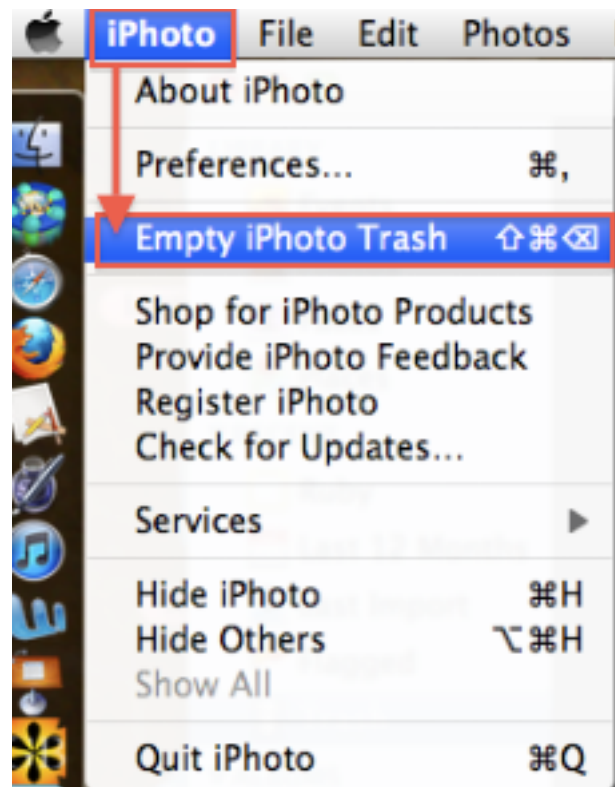
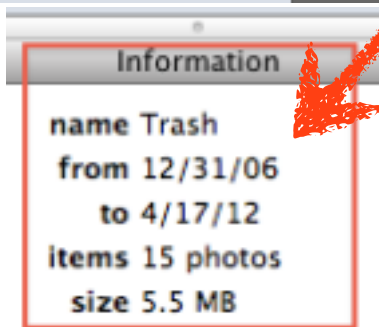
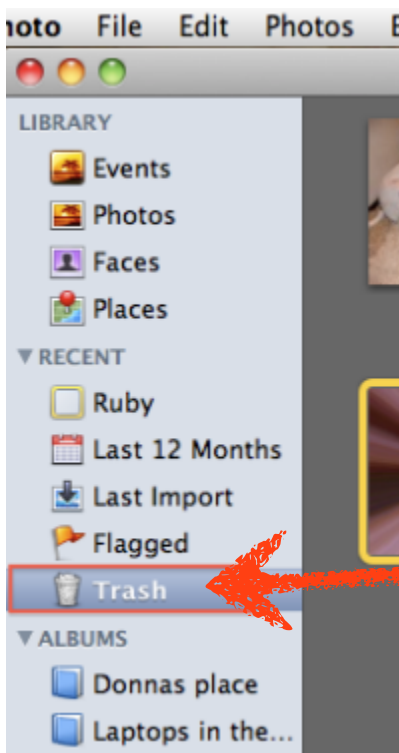


Removing Photos from Your Library:

NOTE:

Remember that removing a photo from a photo album or project only removes that item from the specific album or project because the photos in those places are merely pointers to the actual photo which is stored in the library.

When you remove a photo by deleting it, it goes into the trash. To remove a photo, select it in a Library source and press Delete on the keyboard. The photo is moved from the Library to the Trash. To actually empty the trash you would need to click on iPhoto from the menubar and drag down to Empty iPhoto Trash. (pictured below)



You can recover photos from the Trash by selecting the Trash and moving photos from the Viewing pane back onto the Events or Photos source. The photo is restored in the source on which you dropped it.

You can also use Command Z, (pictured below) to undo your last Move to Trash command.



If you are sure that the Trash contains only photos or images you'll never need again, you can (and should) empty it. This recovers the disk space for you.

Select the Trash and browse its contents to make sure it doesn't contain anything you might need again. When you are ready to take out the digital trash, choose iPhoto from the menubar > then select Empty iPhoto Trash. Click OK at the prompt.

Once you empty iPhoto's Trash, its contents are gone for good so be careful before you use this command.
